AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COMMONWEALTH TO GRANT EASEMENTS OVER, ACROSS AND UPON CERTAIN LAND IN THE TOWN OF SUTTON, FOR THE TRANSMISSION OF ELECTRIC POWER, TO NEW ENGLAND POWER COMPANY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Subject to the approval of the governor, the director of the
2 division of fisheries and game, in the name and behalf of the
3 commonwealth, in consideration of a sum of not less than
4 three hundred dollars, may grant to New England Power
5 Company, an electric company organized and existing under
6 the laws of the commonwealth, easements for the construc-
7 tion, maintenance and operation of electric transmission lines
8 on, over and across a certain portion of land of the common-
9 wealth in the town of Sutton, which land is under the control
10 and custody of said division of fisheries and game. Said
11 easements shall be in such form and at such locations as the
12 said director may approve and deem proper.
