AN ACT PERMITTING THE OPENING OF PLACES OF BUSINESS PRIMARILY ENGAGED IN THE SALE OF SWIMMING POOLS DURING CERTAIN MONTHS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Section 6 of chapter 136 of the General Laws is hereby  
2 amended by adding the following clause:—

3 (45) The opening of a place of business primarily engaged  
4 in the sale of swimming pools during the months of May, June,  
5 July and August.

1. Section 5 of chapter 111 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the following clause:
2. (2) The opening of a place of business shall be subject to the rules of the Board of Health.
3. This act shall take effect on the first day of July next.
