AN ACT TO PROVIDE AN INCREASE IN THE SALARY PAID TO LICENSED PRACTICAL AND ATTENDANT NURSES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the
2 contrary, any person employed as a licensed practical nurse,
3 senior licensed practical nurse, attendant nurse, charge atten-
4 dant nurse, hospital supervisor of attendants or dormitory
5 attendant in the service of the commonwealth shall have their
6 salary schedule increased by one grade; said salary increase
7 shall be retroactively effective to September twenty-seventh,
8 nineteen hundred and sixty-six.

The Constitution of the United States

As amended by the Thirteenth, Fourteenth, Fifteenth, and Nineteenth Amendments

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA
AS AMENDED

Article I
Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.
Section 2
The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
No Representative shall, when elected, be less than 25 Years of Age, seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and when elected shall have been 7 Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen.
Representatives and Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.
No Person shall be a Representative who shall not, when elected, have 7 Years been 7 Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen, and who shall, when elected, have 14 Years been 14 Years a Citizen of the United States, and who shall, when elected, have 21 Years been 21 Years a Citizen of that State in which he shall be chosen.
