

# HOUSE . . . . . No. 1512

By Mr. Cawley of Boston, petition of the Massachusetts State Council #41 AFSC&ME AFL-CIO that provision be made for retroactive compensation for certain state employees whose positions have been reclassified as a result of appeals. Public Service.

## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven.

### AN ACT PROVIDING RETROACTIVE COMPENSATION FOR CERTAIN EMPLOYEES OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Any employee, whose position as a result of an  
2 appeal from the classification established on April first, nine-  
3 teen hundred and sixty-four, as provided in chapter seven hun-  
4 dred and seventy-five of the acts of nineteen hundred and sixty-  
5 three, has been or is subsequently reclassified from the position  
6 schedule in section forty-six, chapter thirty of the General Laws  
7 to the position schedule in section forty-six B, chapter thirty of  
8 the General Laws, shall be compensated for the difference be-  
9 tween the applicable salary rates from April first, nineteen hun-  
10 dred and sixty-four and the position reclassification shall be  
11 effective on April first, nineteen hundred and sixty-four.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.

The Constitution of the State

Article I. The Legislative Power

Section 1. The legislative power shall be vested in the Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen every second year by the people of the several counties.

Section 3. The Senate shall be composed of members chosen every second year by the electors of the several counties.

Section 4. The members of the House of Representatives shall be elected by the people of the several counties.

Section 5. The members of the Senate shall be elected by the electors of the several counties.

Section 6. The House of Representatives shall have the sole power of originating bills for raising revenue.

Section 7. This article shall not be amended.
