## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven.

AN ACT TO FURTHER DEFINE THE TERM "OWNER-REPAIRMAN".

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 90 of the General Laws is  
2 hereby amended by striking out the definition "owner-repair-  
3 man", and inserting in its place the following  
4 definition:— "Owner-Repairman", Any person who is not a  
5 manufacturer, dealer or repairman, and who owns a fleet of  
6 ten or more motor vehicles or trailers which are used by him  
7 exclusively in his principal business, and who maintains an  
8 establishment with facilities for the repair, alteration or  
9 equipment of such motor vehicles or trailers.

1 SECTION 2. The provisions of this act will take effect on  
2 January first, nineteen hundred and sixty-eight.

**The Constitutionality of ...**

As reported by the Committee on the Judiciary, in response to a resolution of the House of Representatives, passed July 1, 1884, relating to the case of the *United States v. ...*

It is the duty of the House and Senate to determine the validity of laws passed by Congress, and for the purpose of the work of the House of Representatives, the following report is submitted:

1. Section 1 of Article I of the Constitution of the United States provides that all legislative powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.

2. Section 2 of Article I provides that the House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in that State.
