AN ACT REQUIRING IMPRISONMENT IN THE STATE PRISON UPON
CONVICTION OF THE CRIME OF UNAUTHORIZED USE OF A MOTOR
VEHICLE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 Paragraph (a) of subdivision (2) of section 24 of chapter
2 90 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out, in
3 line 24, the words "for not less than thirty days nor more
4 than two years, or both", as appearing in chapter 316 of the
5 acts of 1966, and inserting in place thereof the words:—in the
6 state prison for not more than five years, or in a house of
7 correction for not more than two and one half years, or both
8 such fine and imprisonment.

HOUSE No. 1687

By the Committee on Education and the Arts, House of Representatives, for the purpose of amending the laws of the State of New York relating to the State University of New York, as amended.

The Amendments of 1967

Section 1. The State University of New York shall have the honor and privilege of conferring the degree of Doctor of Philosophy on such persons as may be recommended by the Senate of the State University of New York and approved by the Board of Regents of the State University of New York.

Section 2. The State University of New York shall have the honor and privilege of conferring the degree of Doctor of Science on such persons as may be recommended by the Senate of the State University of New York and approved by the Board of Regents of the State University of New York.

1. Paragraph (a) of subdivision (2) of section 31 of chapter 260 of the General Laws hereby amended by reading out in its entirety the words "for not less than thirty days nor more than two years, or both", as appearing in chapter 260 of the General Laws, and inserting in place thereof the words "in the case of a person for not more than two years, or in a house of correction for not more than two and one-half years, or both or such fine and imprisonment."
