AN ACT TO PROTECT THE PUBLIC FROM DAMAGE TO PROPERTY CAUSED
BY UNINSURED MOTOR VEHICLES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 34L of chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting after the first paragraph thereof the
- 3 following new paragraph:—
- 4 Such policy, endorsement or rider, shall further provide
- 5 for the payment of all sums above two hundred dollars and
- 6 up to five thousand dollars which the insured or his legal
- 7 representatives shall be legally entitled to recover as damages
- 8 from the owner or operator of an uninsured motor vehicle
- 9 because of damage to or destruction of the property of the
- 10 insured, caused by accident involving physical contact of
- 11 such uninsured motor vehicle with said property of the in-
- 12 sured and arising out of the ownership, operation, mainte-
- 13 nance or use of such uninsured motor vehicle.
