AN ACT LIMITING THE EMPLOYMENT OF CERTAIN RETIRED TEACHERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 91 of chapter 32 of the General Laws, as amended by
2 chapter 457 of the acts of 1963, is hereby further amended by
3 striking out the next to the last sentence and inserting in place
4 thereof the following sentence:—Notwithstanding the fore-
5 going provisions of this section or similar provisions of any
6 special law, a teacher retired from the service of any county,
7 city, town or district, or a person who was engaged in the in-
8 struction of students in a state college or other educational insti-
9 tution supported by the commonwealth and who retired from
10 the service of the commonwealth, may be employed as a sub-
11 stitute teacher or in another temporary professional capacity by
12 the commonwealth or any political subdivision thereof.

The Constitution of the State

Section 1. The Legislature shall consist of a Senate and a House of Representatives.

Section 2. The Senate shall be composed of twelve members, six from each district, to be elected for terms of four years, one-half of them to be elected in each year.

1. Section 3. The House of Representatives shall be composed of members chosen every second year by the people of the State, and the number shall not exceed one for every thirty thousand persons.
2. Section 4. The Legislature shall assemble on the first Monday in January of each year, and shall continue its session until the first Monday in March of the next year.
3. Section 5. The Legislature shall have the power to pass bills for the raising and expending of money, to regulate commerce, to create and organize courts, and to make and alter the laws.
4. Section 6. The Legislature shall have the power to impeach and remove from office any officer of the State, and to fill the vacancy so created.
5. Section 7. The Legislature shall have the power to create and organize any office, and to remove any officer so created.
