AN ACT DIRECTING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BRISTOL COUNTY TO CONSTRUCT AN ADDITIONAL BUILDING AT THE BRISTOL COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SCHOOL AND AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING OF MONEY FOR SAID PURPOSE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The county commissioners of the county of
2 Bristol are hereby authorized to raise and expend a sum not
3 exceeding five hundred thousand dollars for the construction,
4 originally equipping and furnishing, on land now owned by
5 the county, of an addition to the main school building,
6 including plans and specifications, architects fees and ex-
7 penses.

1 SECTION 2. For the purpose aforesaid, the treasurer of said
2 county, with the approval of the county commissioners, may
3 borrow from time to time upon the credit of the county such
4 sums as may be necessary not exceeding, in the aggregate,
5 five hundred thousand dollars and may issue bonds or notes
6 therefor which shall bear on their face the words, Bristol
7 County Agricultural School Loan, Act of 1967. Each author-
8 ized issue shall constitute a separate loan. Such bonds or
9 notes shall be payable in such annual installments beginning
10 not more than one year from the date thereof, as will

11 extinguish each loan in no more than twenty years from their
12 dates, so that the amount of such annual payment in any
13 year shall not be less than the amount of the principal of the
14 loan payable in any subsequent year. Such bonds or notes
15 shall be signed by the county treasurer and countersigned by
16 a majority of the county commissioners. The county may sell
17 the said securities at public or private sale, upon such terms
18 and conditions as the county commissioners may deem
19 proper, but not for less than their par value.

20 Indebtedness incurred hereunder shall, except as herein
21 provided, be subject to chapter thirty-five of the General
22 Laws. The county treasurer, with the approval of the county
23 commissioners, may issue temporary notes of the county,
24 payable in not more than one year from their date, in
25 anticipation of the issue of serial bonds or notes under this
26 act, but the time within which such serial bonds or notes shall
27 become due and payable shall not, by reason of such
28 temporary notes, be extended beyond the time fixed by this
29 act. Any notes issued in anticipation of the serial bonds or
30 notes shall be paid from the proceeds thereof.
