

HOUSE No. 3063

By Mr. Quinn of Boston, petition of Thomas F. Ganley that members of the police force of cities and towns, the Metropolitan District Commission or the Capitol Police be required to attend a police training school. Public Safety.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Seven.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT ANY PERSON APPOINTED AS A REGULAR POLICE OFFICER ON A PERMANENT BASIS IN ANY CITY OR TOWN, THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT POLICE OR THE CAPITOL POLICE SHALL ATTEND A POLICE TRAINING SCHOOL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 41 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking
2 out section 96B, inserted by section 3 of chapter 564 of the acts
3 of 1964, and inserting in place thereof the following section:—

4 *Section 96B.* Every person who receives an appointment as a
5 regular police officer on a permanent full-time basis in any city
6 or in any town, the metropolitan district commission police or
7 the capitol police shall within one year of the date of his ap-
8 pointment be assigned to and shall attend a police training school
9 approved by the municipal police training council, and shall
10 complete the prescribed courses of study.

11 Any police officer attending such school shall be paid his wages
12 as police officer. He shall also receive such reasonable expenses
13 as may be determined by the appointing authority.
