AN ACT AUTHORIZING COUNTY OF ESSEX TO APPROPRIATE PAYMENT OF CERTAIN BILLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The county of Essex is hereby authorized to
2 pay a sum of sixty-three hundred and fifty-nine dollars and
3 forty cents to the Essex County Tourist Council by reason a
4 bill was incurred over the appropriation of chapter 462 of the
5 acts of nineteen hundred and sixty-six.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
