AN ACT RELATING TO THE USE OF LOCAL FACILITIES BY THE MASSACHUSETTS BOARD OF REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGES.

1 *Whereas*, The deferred operation of this act would tend to
2 defeat its purpose, which is to enable cities and towns to
3 provide facilities for the use of regional community colleges,
4 therefore it is hereby declared to be an emergency law,
5 necessary for the immediate preservation of the public con-
6 venience.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 SECTION 1. The second paragraph of section 28 of chapter
2 15 of the General Laws, as appearing in section 7 of chapter
3 572 of the acts of 1965, is hereby amended by adding the
4 following two sentences:—Any city or town may convey any
5 real or tangible personal property to the commonwealth for
6 the use of a regional community college, whether acquired by
7 eminent domain or otherwise, upon such terms as the city
8 through its city council or a town by town meeting may
9 determine, with or without consideration. Such use shall be
10 deemed a municipal purpose under the laws relating to the
11 purchase or taking of property by cities and towns, and no
12 departmental request shall be required pursuant to section
13 thirty of chapter forty-three.

1 SECTION 2. All acquisitions and conveyances heretofore
2 made or authorized by the cities and towns for the use of the
3 board, which would be valid under the foregoing section, are
4 hereby validated and confirmed.
