RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION RELATIVE TO THE FEASIBILITY OF CONTINUING COUNTY GOVERNMENT OR CERTAIN FUNCTIONS THEREOF, OF ELIMINATING CERTAIN OTHER FUNCTIONS AND OF REARRANGING COUNTY BOUNDARIES.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of three
2 members of the senate, six members of the house of repre-
3 sentatives, and six persons to be appointed by the governor,
4 one of whom shall be a county commissioner and one of whom
5 shall be a sheriff, is hereby established for the purpose of
6 making an investigation and study relative to the feasibility
7 of continuing county government or certain functions thereof;
8 of eliminating certain other functions, and of rearranging
9 county boundaries.
