RESOLUTIONS ON THE DEATH OF REPRESENTATIVE STEPHEN T. CHMURA OF HOLYOKE.

1 *Whereas*, The House of Representatives has learned with
2 great sorrow of the death of the Honorable Stephen T. Chmura
3 who since 1951 has sincerely and faithfully represented the
4 12th Hampden District; and

5 *Whereas*, During his term of office he served on many im-
6 portant committees and won the respect of the members by the
7 conscientious manner in which he discharged his duties; and

8 *Whereas*, By the death of Stephen T. Chmura, not only the
9 Commonwealth lost the services of an able legislator, but also
10 the city of Holyoke which he served as an Alderman; and

11 *Whereas*, During his many years of devoted public service,
12 Representative Chmura won the confidence, respect and af-
13 fection of his associates and those whom he so faithfully served
14 because of his dedication, his friendly manner and his faithful-
15 ness in his work; therefore be it
