AN ACT INCREASING THE SALARY OF JUDGES OF PROBATE IN SUFFOLK, MIDDLESEX AND NORFOLK COUNTIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 217 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 striking out section 34, as most recently amended by section 4
3 of chapter 699 of the acts of 1966, and inserting in place thereof
4 the following section:—

5 *Section 34.* The salaries of all judges of probate shall be
6 paid by the commonwealth and are hereby established as
7 follows:—
