AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE IMPOSITION OF A LIEN, THE SEIZURE AND SALE OF A MOTOR VEHICLE FOR FAILURE TO OBEY TEN OR MORE NOTICES FOR PARKING VIOLATIONS IN THE CITY OF BOSTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 If it shall appear to a judge of a district court that there
2 has been a failure to obey within twenty-one days after the
3 date of violation each of ten or more notices affixed in any
4 one calendar year in the city of Boston as provided in section
5 twenty C of chapter ninety of the General Laws to a motor
6 vehicle, such judge may issue an order imposing a lien on
7 such motor vehicle for the fines provided in said notices and
8 empowering the police commissioner of the city of Boston or
9 such sergeants or officers of higher rank in the police depart-
10 ment of said city as said commissioner may from time to time
11 designate to seize such vehicle and remove the same to some
12 convenient place and there hold the same until the expiration
13 of fifteen days or the receipt of due notice of the payment of
14 the reasonable cost of such removal and of the storage
15 charges and of the fines provided in said notices, whichever
16 first occurs, and if at the expiration of said fifteen days such
17 payment has not been made, to sell at public auction all
18 right, title and interest therein of the owner thereof and
19 apply the proceeds of such sale first to the reasonable cost of
20 such sale, next to the reasonable cost of removing such
21 vehicle, then to the storage charges and then to the fines
22 provided in said notices, and thereupon pay any balance to
23 the owner of such vehicle.
