RESOLVE IN FAVOR OF RICHARD ADAMS.

1 *Resolved*, That for the purpose of discharging a moral obliga-
2 tion of the commonwealth, and subject to appropriation, there
3 be allowed and paid out of the state treasury, to Irving Adams,
4 father of Richard Adams, a minor, of Framingham, the sum of
5 five thousand dollars, as compensation for personal injuries
6 sustained by Richard Adams and as reimbursement for medical
7 expenses incurred by Irving Adams for Richard Adams arising
8 out of an accident which occurred on June third, nineteen hun-
9 dred and sixty-seven in front of the premises of Natoli's, Inc.,
10 225 Worcester Road, Framingham, when Richard Adams came
11 upon the scene of armed robbery and murder and while attempt-
12 ing to assist the victim of the armed robbery and murder, was
13 shot and wounded by the assailant, suffering severe, permanent
14 and disabling injuries and incurring as a result thereof extensive
15 medical bills.
