The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Eight.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE FILING OF A WRITTEN REQUEST THAT THE NAME OF THE FATHER APPEAR ON THE BIRTH RECORD OF AN ILLEGITIMATE CHILD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1 of chapter 46 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by adding after the word "mother" in the second
3 sentence of the second paragraph the words:—, which request
4 must be received with the copy of the report of such birth
5 required by this chapter to be filed with the clerk or registrar
6 of the city or town where the birth occurred.

The Commission on TV Regulation

In the year 1961, the Commission on TV Regulation was established.
