AN ACT DIRECTING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS TO CONSTRUCT A SKATING RINK IN THE TOWN OF NANTUCKET.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 The department of public works is hereby authorized and
- 2 directed to construct in the town of Nantucket an artificial
- 3 ice skating rink. For said purpose said department may
- 4 expend such sums as may be appropriated therefor.
