AN ACT DIRECTING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF BRISTOL COUNTY TO CONSTRUCT AND EQUIP AN ADDITION TO AND TO ALTER THE MAIN SCHOOL BUILDING AT THE BRISTOL COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SCHOOL AND AUTHORIZING THE BORROWING OF MONEY FOR SAID PURPOSE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The county commissioners of Bristol county are
2 hereby authorized to raise and expend a sum not exceeding
3 one million two hundred and fifty thousand dollars for the
4 construction, originally equipping and furnishing, on land
5 now owned by the county, of an addition to and alterations
6 of the main school building, including plans and specifica-
7 tions, architects' fees and legal fees and expenses.

1 SECTION 2. For the purpose aforesaid, the treasurer of said
2 county, with the approval of the county commissioners, may
3 borrow from time to time upon the credit of the county such
4 sums as may be necessary not exceeding, in the aggregate,
5 one million two hundred and fifty thousand dollars and may
6 issue bonds or notes therefor which shall constitute a separate
7 loan. Such bonds or notes shall be payable in such annual
8 installments beginning not more than one year from the date
9 thereof, as will extinguish each loan in no more than twenty
10 years from their dates, so that the amount of such annual
11 payment in any year shall not be less than the amount of the

12 principal of the loan payable in any subsequent year. Such
13 bonds or notes shall be signed by the county treasurer and
14 countersigned by a majority of the county commissioners.
15 The county may sell the said securities at public or private
16 sale, upon such terms and conditions as the county commis-
17 sioners may deem proper, but not for less than their par
18 value.

19 Indebtedness incurred hereunder shall, except as herein
20 provided, be subject to chapter thirty-five of the General
21 Laws. The county treasurer, with the approval of the county
22 commissioners may issue temporary notes of the county,
23 payable in not more than one year from their date, in
24 anticipation of the issue of serial bonds or notes under this
25 act, but the time within which such serial bonds or notes shall
26 become due and payable shall not, by reason of such tempo-
27 rary notes, be extended beyond the time fixed by this act.
28 Any notes issued in anticipation of the serial bonds or notes
29 shall be paid from the proceeds thereof.
