By Mr. Dolan of Ipswich, petition of the Massachusetts Selectmen's Association, Inc., that persons entering municipal service after age sixty be allowed to continue working after age seventy. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Eight.

AN ACT TO PROVIDE THAT PERSONS EMPLOYED IN MUNICIPAL SERVICE AFTER AGE SIXTY SHALL NOT BE REQUIRED TO RETIRE AT AGE SEVENTY.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 2 the General Laws no person who enters municipal service after
- 3 age sixty shall be required to retire at age seventy.
