## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Eight.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT THE CIVIL SERVICE COMMISSION AND THE DIRECTOR OF CIVIL SERVICE SHALL ACT AS A BOARD IN CERTAIN MATTERS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 1 of chapter 13 of the General Laws is hereby
- 2 amended by adding the following:—The civil service com-
- 3 mission and the director of civil service shall act as a board in
- 4 all matters affecting the division of civil service.

By Mr. McPherson of Michigan, a bill (H. R. 1335) for the relief of the Government and the citizens of the United States, and for other purposes, was read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary, which reported thereon at the following session of the House.

### THE COMPENSATION OF JUDGES

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Six.

AN ACT providing that the civil service commission shall have power to employ such persons as may be necessary for the efficient conduct of its business, and for other purposes.

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, that by the authority of the same, as follows:

Section 1 of chapter 15 of the Civil Service Law is hereby amended by adding the following:—The civil service commission and the director of civil service shall not be bound in all matters relating to the division of civil service.
