By Mrs. Newman of Cambridge, petition of the Bunker Hill Monument Association that the Metropolitan District Commission be authorized to acquire the site of the Bunker Hill Quarry and adjacent portions of the Granite Railway in Quincy. Urban Affairs.

AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE AND DIRECT THE METROPOLITAN DISTRICT COMMISSION TO ACQUIRE THE SITE OF THE BUNKER HILL QUARRY AND ADJACENT PORTION OF THE GRANITE RAILWAY IN QUINCY BY GIFT, PURCHASE OR EMINENT DOMAIN AS A PART OF THE BLUE HILLS RESERVATION.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The Metropolitan District Commission is
2 hereby authorized and directed to acquire by eminent domain
3 under chapter seventy-nine or by purchase, gift, or otherwise
4 such land, buildings, and structures and easements, interests
5 or rights in land in Quincy as may be necessary to protect,
6 preserve, restore and maintain the Bunker Hill Quarry and
7 the adjoining section of the Granite Railroad, the first
8 commercial railroad in America.

1 SECTION 2. For such purposes the said commission may
2 expend such sums as may be appropriated therefor.

THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

Article I, Section 1

All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Representatives and Electors in Congress shall be chosen every second Year, in the most liberal Manner that shall be directed by the Laws of the United States.

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be included within this Union, according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, (including bound Persons, (other than Apprentices, and Indians not taxed) three fifths of all other Persons.)

Representatives and Electors shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors in the most liberal Manner.
