By Miss Howe of Somerville, petition of Marie E. Howe that the county commissioners of Middlesex County be authorized to transfer to the city of Somerville land and buildings comprising the Somerville District Court. Counties.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF MIDDLESEX COUNTY TO TRANSFER TO THE CITY OF SOMERVILLE CERTAIN LAND AND BUILDINGS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The county commissioners of Middlesex county
2 are hereby authorized and directed to convey to the city of
3 Somerville, the land and buildings presently comprising the
4 Somerville district court on and located at number nineteen
5 Walnut street.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon the completion
2 of the new court house facilities on the Fellsway in said
3 city.

18 attendance upon said court. Said commissioners may expend
19 for the purposes of this act, including the preparation of
20 plans and specifications in connection therewith and for
21 landscaping, such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding, in
22 the aggregate, six hundred thousand dollars. Any sums
23 received from the Federal government for the purposes of this
24 act shall be included in, and considered a part of, the total
25 amount authorized to be expended hereunder.

1 SECTION 2. For the purposes authorized by section one, the
2 treasurer of said county, with the approval of the county
3 commissioners, may borrow upon the credit of the county
4 such sums as may be necessary, not exceeding, in the aggre-
5 gate, six hundred thousand dollars, and may issue bonds or
6 notes of the county therefor, which shall bear on the face the
7 words, Second District Court of Eastern Worcester Loan, Act
8 of 1968. Each authorized issue shall constitute a separate
9 loan and such loans shall be payable not more than twenty
10 years from their dates. The bonds or notes shall be signed by
11 the county treasurer and countersigned by a majority of the
12 county commissioners. The county may sell the said securities
13 at public or private sale, upon such terms and conditions as
14 the county commissioners may deem proper, but not for less
15 than their par value. Indebtedness incurred hereunder shall,
16 except as herein provided, be subject to chapter thirty-five of
17 the General Laws.

1 SECTION 3. The county treasurer of said county, with the
2 approval of the county commissioners, may issue temporary
3 notes of the county, payable in not more than one year from
4 their dates, in anticipation of the issue of serial bonds or
5 notes under this act, but the time within which such serial
6 bonds or notes shall become due and payable shall not, by
7 reason of such temporary notes, be extended beyond the time
8 fixed by this act. Any notes issued in anticipation of the serial
9 bonds or notes shall be paid from the proceeds thereof.

1 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
