AN ACT INCREASING THE FINE FOR DRUNKENNESS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 48 of chapter 272 of the General Laws, as appear-
- 2 ing in section 20 of chapter 715 of the acts of 1956, is hereby
- 3 amended by striking out, in line 6, the word "fifteen" and
- 4 inserting in place thereof the word:—fifty.
