AN ACT GRANTING A NON-CONTRIBUTORY PENSION TO THE WIDOW OF THE LATE LT. EDWARD D. WALSH, A POLICE OFFICER IN THE CITY OF WOBURN FOR THIRTY-EIGHT YEARS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. In consideration of promoting the public good  
2 and long and meritorious service from December twenty-eight,  
3 nineteen hundred and twenty-two until October six, nineteen  
4 hundred and sixty by the late Lt. Edward D. Walsh as a police  
5 officer in the city of Woburn, the said city is hereby authorized  
6 to grant a non-contributory pension to Mrs. Mary F. Walsh  
7 of Woburn, widow of said Lt. Edward D. Walsh in the amount  
8 of two thousand dollars per annum, under the provisions of  
9 section ninety-five A of chapter thirty-two of the General Laws.

1 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon the approval  
2 of the Mayor and a majority vote of the members of the Woburn  
3 city council.
