AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE RETURN OF SUSPENDED LICENSES, CERTIFICATES OF REGISTRATION AND NUMBER PLATES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 29 of chapter 90 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by striking out the ninth sentence and inserting in
3 place thereof the following sentence:—Every such officer
4 upon the request of the registrar, shall demand forthwith the
5 license of any operator and the certificate of registration and
6 number plates of any motor vehicle situated in a city or town
7 within such officers jurisdiction when said license or certifi-
8 cate has been suspended or revoked by the registrar and shall
9 forward the same to the registrar.
