AN ACT RELATING TO THE POWERS OF THE MASSACHUSETTS BAY TRANSPORTATION AUTHORITY IN CONSTRUCTING, EXTENDING, MODIFYING OR IMPROVING MASS TRANSPORTATION FACILITIES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Paragraph (*k*) of section 3 of chapter 161A of the General
2 Laws, inserted therein by section 18 of chapter 563 of the
3 acts of 1964, is hereby amended by adding at the end of thereof
4 the following sentence:—Subject to the provisions of para-
5 graph (*o*) of this section and for the purpose of this paragraph
6 or for the purposes of any special act providing for the con-
7 struction, extension, modification, or improvement of mass
8 transportation facilities in the area constituting the authority,
9 the authority shall have and exercise in its own name and
10 behalf all the powers conferred upon the Metropolitan Transit
11 Authority by section four of chapter six hundred and forty-
12 nine of the acts of nineteen hundred and forty-nine with re-
13 spect to works authorized by said chapter six hundred and
14 forty-nine and the provisions of section five of said chapter
15 six hundred and forty-nine shall apply to works constructed
16 pursuant to this paragraph or to any such special act.
