RESOLVE PROVIDING FOR AN INVESTIGATION AND STUDY BY A SPECIAL COMMISSION OF THE ADMISSION PRACTICES RELATIVE TO NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS IN THE REGIONAL COMMUNITY COLLEGES, STATE COLLEGES, TECHNOLOGICAL INSTITUTES AND THE UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS WITH A VIEW TO ESTABLISHING PREFERENCE ADMISSION PRACTICES FOR RESIDENT STUDENTS OF THE COMMONWEALTH.

1 *Resolved*, That a special commission, to consist of two mem-
2 bers of the senate, three members of the house of representa-
3 tives, the commissioner of education or his designee, and three
4 persons to be appointed by the governor, is hereby established
5 for the purpose of making an investigation and study of the
6 admission practices relative to non-resident students in the
7 regional community colleges, state colleges, technological in-
8 stitutes and the University of Massachusetts with a view to
9 establishing preference admission practices for resident stu-
10 dents of the commonwealth.

11 Said commission shall report to the general court on or be-
12 fore the last Wednesday of June in the current year.
