AN ACT EXTENDING THE SPECIAL HEARING PROCEDURES FOR PERSONS COMMITTED OR CONFINED AT BRIDGEWATER STATE HOSPITAL AND STATE HOSPITALS UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MENTAL HEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

The Commission on the Organization of the Executive Branch of the Government

Report of the Commission

The Commission on the Organization of the Executive Branch of the Government was organized by Executive Order on July 1, 1955. Its mandate was to study the organization of the executive branch of the Federal Government and to recommend such changes as would improve the efficiency and effectiveness of the Government. The Commission's report, published in 1955, contains a number of recommendations, including the creation of a new executive department, the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, and the reorganization of the Department of Defense. The Commission also recommended the creation of a new position, the Director of the Executive Office of the President, and the reorganization of the Executive Office of the President. The Commission's report is a landmark document in the history of the Federal Government, and its recommendations have been largely implemented.
