AN ACT AMENDING THE FIRE SALE LAW.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 28F of chapter 93 of the General Laws as inserted
2 by Section 3 of chapter 178, of the acts of 1958, is hereby
3 further amended by deleting said section 28F and inserting in
4 place thereof the following new section:—
5 *Section 28F.* No person shall advertise or offer for sale a
6 stock of goods, wares or merchandise under designation of
7 “fire sale”, or other designation of like meaning, indicating
8 the effect or result of fire, water or smoke, unless the goods,
9 wares or merchandise so advertised or so offered for sale have,
10 in fact, been salvaged from a fire, and unless such goods, wares
11 or merchandise are segregated and identified. No other goods,
12 wares or merchandise shall be included under such designation
13 in any form of advertising, tagging or labeling.
