## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Eight.

AN ACT TO PERMIT THE REGISTERED VOTERS OF CITIES AND TOWNS TO VOTE BIENNIALY RELATIVE TO PERMITTING VETERANS' ORGANIZATIONS AND CERTAIN CORPORATIONS AND CHARTERED CLUBS TO CONDUCT "BLITZ" GAMES, SO-CALLED.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 If a majority of the voters in a city or town vote in the  
2 affirmative the licensing authorities of said city or town may  
3 issue permits to veterans' organizations and to clubs or  
4 corporations which have been duly chartered under the  
5 provisions of chapter one hundred and eighty of the General  
6 Laws, to conduct "blitz" games, so-called. Such organizations,  
7 clubs or corporations, to which a permit has been issued, shall  
8 be required to conduct such games on their own premises  
9 staffed by personnel from their own membership roles and the  
10 revenue derived therefrom shall be deposited in a charities  
11 account of the treasury of the respective organization, club or  
12 corporation. No personnel shall be hired to conduct such  
13 games on a percentage of gross or profit basis.
