

By Mr. McGee of Lynn, petition of Thomas W. McGee that certain positions of the Division of Motorboats within the Registry of Motor Vehicles be placed under the civil service law. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

AN ACT PLACING CERTAIN POSITIONS OF THE DIVISION OF MOTORBOATS WITHIN THE REGISTRY OF MOTOR VEHICLES UNDER CIVIL SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 12 of chapter 16 of the General Laws, as
2 appearing in section 1 of chapter 275 of the acts of 1960, is
3 hereby amended by striking out the second paragraph and
4 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph:—

5 The director may, subject to the provisions of chapter
6 thirty-one, with the approval of the registrar of motor
7 vehicles, employ such hearing officers, inspectors and such
8 administrative, technical, clerical and other employees as in
9 his opinion the duties of the division may require, and may
10 expend for such purpose and any other necessary expenses
11 such amounts as may be appropriated therefor out of the
12 recreational boating fund. The positions and compensation of
13 such employees shall be classified in accordance with sections
14 forty-five to fifty, inclusive, of chapter thirty.

1 SECTION 2. Any incumbent, upon the effective date of this
2 act, of an office or position referred to in section one made
3 subject by the provisions thereof, the civil service laws and
4 rules, shall be entitled to be appointed to said office or
5 position under said laws and rules, upon passing a qualifying
6 examination and upon certification by the director of civil
7 service, but any incumbent upon said date of any such

8 position who fails to pass any such qualifying examination
9 may be continued by the appointing authority in such office
10 or position for the remainder of the term, if any, for which he
11 was appointed, but shall not otherwise be subject to the
12 provisions of the civil service laws and rules.
