AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF NORFOLK COUNTY TO CONSTRUCT A DORMITORY AT THE NORFOLK COUNTY AGRICULTURAL SCHOOL.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to
2 the contrary, the county commissioners of Norfolk county are
3 hereby authorized and directed to construct at the Norfolk
4 County Agricultural School, a dormitory to house adequately
5 thirty-six students, including a cafeteria therein to serve ad-
6 equately one hundred thirty-six students.

1 SECTION 2. Said authorization is subject to an appropriation
2 therefor, in the sum of approximately three hundred thousand
3 dollars.

Report of the Commission on Government

AN ACT TO REORGANIZE THE EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT AND TO PROVIDE FOR A COMMISSION ON GOVERNMENT TO STUDY AND REPORT ON THE ORGANIZATION AND ADMINISTRATION OF THE GOVERNMENT.

It is enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same as amended, that the Commission on Government be organized as follows:

Section 1. The Commission on Government shall consist of seven members, to be appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate. The Commission shall have the honor of the rank of Major-General in the Army, and shall be organized and held in session at the State House, Boston, on the first day of January next, and shall continue in office until the first day of January next following. The Commission shall have the right to call upon any department or officer of the Government for information and to receive from any such department or officer all such information as may be necessary for the performance of its duties.

Section 2. The Commission on Government shall report to the Governor and the Senate on or before the first day of January next following the date of its organization. The report shall be printed and distributed to the members of the Senate and the House of Representatives.
