AN ACT INCREASING THE PENALTIES FOR INTERFERING WITH FIRE FIGHTING OPERATIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 268 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 striking out section 32A and inserting in place thereof the
3 following section:—

4 *Section 32A.* Whoever willfully obstructs, interferes with or
5 hinders a fire fighter in the lawful performance of his duty, or
6 whoever willfully obstructs, interferes with or hinders a fire
7 fighting force in the lawful performance of its duty, shall be
8 punished by a fine of not less than one hundred dollars nor
9 more than one thousand dollars or by imprisonment for not
10 less than thirty days nor more than five years or both.
