AN ACT DEFINING PERSONS SERVING ON SCHOOL COMMITTEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 32 of chapter 43 of the General Laws, as amended
2 by chapter 318 of the acts of 1949, is hereby further amended
3 by inserting the following sentence: — No member of the
4 school committee, except the mayor, shall, while a member
5 thereof hold any other state, county or city office. No mem-
6 ber of a school committee shall have held any other elective
7 office within three calendar years.
