AN ACT PROVIDING FOR FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE BY THE COMMONWEALTH TO CITIES AND TOWNS IN ELIMINATING RACIAL IMBALANCE IN THE SCHOOLS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 506 of the acts of 1966 is hereby amended by adding the following section: —

3 *Section 12C.* The commonwealth shall afford financial assistance to those cities and towns for transportation costs and any and all salaries of teachers and others required in a bus-
6 ing program to end racial imbalance in the schools as defined
7 in section thirty-seven D of chapter six hundred and forty-one
8 of the acts of nineteen hundred and sixty-five.
