AN ACT FURTHER REGULATING THE REGISTRATION OF VOTERS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 3 of chapter 51 of the General Laws is hereby
2 amended by inserting after the second sentence the following
3 sentence:—Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions any
4 person otherwise eligible to vote may at his request be listed
5 as a registered voter in a ward or precinct where he resided
6 for more than six months.
