The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Sixty-Nine.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT TEACHERS IN THE INSTITUTIONS OF THE COMMONWEALTH BE GIVEN SALARY CREDIT FOR DEGREES HELD.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Notwithstanding any provisions of the law to the contrary,
2 the director of personnel and standardization shall advance
3 teachers in institutions of the Commonwealth who hold
4 Bachelor's degrees three job groups in the general salary
5 schedule of the Commonwealth, and he shall advance said
6 teachers who hold earned Master's degrees three job groups,
7 and he shall advance head teachers one job group at the ap-
8 propriate degree level and he shall advance principals two
9 job groups at the appropriate degree level.
