AN ACT PROVIDING THAT ANY BUILDING IN WHICH A PERSON WORKS
BE PROPERLY LIGHTED, VENTILATED AND KEPT CLEAN.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General
Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Chapter 149 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 striking out section 113, as most recently amended by chapter
3 158 of the acts of 1968, and inserting in place thereof the
4 following section: —

5 *Section 113.* Every factory, workshop, manufacturing, me-
6 chanical and mercantile establishment, railroad freight house,
7 railway express terminal and any other building in which a
8 person is employed shall be well lighted, well ventilated and
9 kept free from unsanitary conditions, and work rooms therein
10 in actual use shall be properly heated during the period from
11 October fifteenth to May fifteenth, according to reasonable
12 rules and regulations adopted by the department establishing
13 minimum requirements with reference thereto.
