AN ACT PROVIDING FOR COLLECTIVE PURCHASES
BY POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Chapter 7 of the General Laws is hereby amended by strik-

4 *Section 22A:* Notwithstanding any contrary provision of law
5 relative to collective purchasing, but subject, however, to all
6 other laws regulating public purchases and competitive bid-
7 ding, the Commonwealth and one or more cities, towns, dis-
8 tricts, counties or authorities, or two or more cities, towns,
9 districts, counties, or authorities, hereinafter called political
10 subdivisions, subject to such procedure rules and regulations
11 as may be prescribed by the State Purchasing Agent, may
12 join together for the purpose of obtaining and accepting com-
13 petitive bids on similar items of material, supplies or equip-
14 ment, which they intend to buy, so as to enable them to
15 procure a volume low price on such items, provided that each
16 such political subdivision, on whose behalf a bid is obtained,
17 shall accept sole responsibility for its share of such purchase.
