AN ACT REQUIRING THE ATTORNEY GENERAL TO PREPARE A COMPILATION OF OPINIONS AND LETTERS RENDERED BY HIM CONCERNING THE CODE OF ETHICS FOR STATE, COUNTY AND MUNICIPAL EMPLOYEES.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:
