

HOUSE No. 612

By Mr. Serlin of Boston, petition of I. Edward Serlin for legislation to provide that classifications of risks and premium charges under the compulsory motor vehicle liability insurance law shall be uniform throughout the Commonwealth. Insurance.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT CLASSIFICATIONS OF RISKS AND PREMIUM CHARGES UNDER THE COMPULSORY MOTOR VEHICLE LIABILITY INSURANCE LAW SHALL BE UNIFORM THROUGHOUT THE COMMONWEALTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 The first paragraph of section 113B of chapter 175 of the
2 General Laws, as appearing in section 2 of chapter 643 of the
3 acts of 1968, is hereby amended by striking out the first
4 sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sen-
5 tence:—The commissioner shall annually, on or before
6 September fifteenth, after due hearing and investigation, fix
7 and establish fair and reasonable classifications of risks,
8 including classifications of risks based on accident involve-
9 ment, and adequate, just, reasonable and non-discriminatory
10 premium charges to be used and charged by companies in
11 connection with the issue or execution of motor vehicle
12 liability policies or bonds, both as defined in section thirty-
13 four A of chapter ninety, for the ensuing calendar year or
14 any part thereof; provided, however, that said classifications
15 and premium charges shall be uniform throughout the com-
16 monwealth and shall not be fixed or established according to
17 districts or zones.

The Constitution of the State of Illinois

As amended by the People of the State of Illinois

SECTION 1. The legislative power shall be vested in a Senate and House of Representatives. The Senate shall be composed of twelve members, and the House of Representatives of thirteen members. The members of the Senate shall be elected for a term of four years, and the members of the House of Representatives for a term of two years.

SECTION 2. The Governor shall be elected for a term of four years, and shall hold office until the first day of January next following his election. He shall be eligible for re-election only once.

3. The first Congress shall convene on the first day of January next following the election of the Governor.
4. The Governor shall have the honor and privilege of the chair, and shall preside over the Senate and the House of Representatives.
5. The Governor shall have the power to pardon and commute the punishment of criminals, and to grant reprieves and commutations of punishment.
6. The Governor shall have the power to grant pardons and commutations of punishment to persons who have been convicted of crimes, and to grant reprieves and commutations of punishment to persons who have been sentenced to imprisonment.
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
