AN ACT TO AUTHORIZE A PROGRAM OF STATE GRANT-IN-AID PROGRAMS
TO COMMUNITY ACTION AGENCIES.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in
General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as
follows:*

1 SECTION 1. For the purposes of this act, (1) "community
2 action program" means a program, project or activity which:
3 (a) mobilizes and utilizes resources, public or private of any
4 urban or rural, or combined urban and rural, geographical
5 area including, but not limited to, a municipality or group of
6 municipalities in an attack on poverty; (b) is developed, con-
7 ducted and administered with the maximum feasible partici-
8 pation of residents of the areas and members of the groups
9 served; and (c) is conducted, administered or coordinated by
10 a community action agency; (2) "community action agency"
11 means (a) a public or private nonprofit agency designated by
12 and authorized to accept funds from the federal office of
13 economic opportunity or any other department or agency of
14 the United States to which any of the powers of said office
15 may be transferred, for a community action program under
16 the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, as amended.

1 SECTION 2. (a) The state, acting by and in the discretion of
2 the commissioner of the department of community affairs
3 may enter into a contract with a community action agency
4 for state financial assistance for community action programs
5 in the form of a state grant-in-aid for the purposes and in the

6 amounts hereinafter stated: (1) to pay all or part of the
7 non-federal share of a federally assisted program; (2) to
8 expand a federally assisted program beyond the scope for
9 which the agency has received a federal grant-in-aid, two-
10 thirds of the amount by which the cost of the expanded
11 program as approved by the commissioner exceeds the
12 amount of the federal grant-in-aid thereof; or (3) to con-
13 tinue a program for which such federal grant-in-aid had been
14 received and has thereafter been reduced or discontinued, or
15 to undertake a program for which a federal grant-in-aid is not
16 available, two-thirds of the total cost of such program as
17 determined by the commissioner; provided no contract shall
18 be entered into pursuant to subdivision (2) or (3) in any
19 fiscal year until the commissioner determines that funds are
20 available to finance all proposed contracts for that fiscal year
21 for assistance pursuant to subdivision (1) hereof. (b) With
22 respect to proposed contracts for grants-in-aid made pursuant
23 to subsection (a) (1) hereof, the commissioner may require
24 such audit, financial and related controls as he deems reason-
25 ably necessary and shall approve the program content of such
26 proposed contracts for grants-in-aid so long as the federal
27 share of such federally assisted programs shall be fifty per
28 cent or more. With respect to proposed contracts for grants-
29 in-aid made pursuant to subsection (a) (1) hereof, where the
30 federal share of such federally assisted programs is less than
31 fifty per cent, or pursuant to subsections (a) (2) and (a) (3)
32 hereof, the commissioner shall review the program content of
33 such proposals so as to determine whether they are designed
34 to accomplish the purposes specified in this section and
35 section one and may require such audit, financial and related
36 controls as he deems reasonably necessary. (c) So much of the
37 cost of human resource development program as is not met
38 by either a federal grant-in-aid or by a state grant-in-aid
39 pursuant to this section may be paid by a municipality, any
40 agency, board, commission or department thereof, or any
41 public authority, or any private organization, in cash or in
42 kind, including, but not limited to in the discretion of the
43 commissioner, additional plant and equipment, added ser-
44 vices and increases in financial assistance furnished thereby,
45 provided, only such increments in plant and equipment,

46 services and financial assistance furnished thereby, provided,
47 only such increments in plant and equipment, services and
48 financial assistance as (1) are used for or in connection with
49 community action programs, (2) are funded otherwise than
50 by federal or state financial assistance and (3) are not
51 general assistance payments may be considered as payment
52 by a municipality under this section. (d) The commissioner is
53 further authorized to make available technical assistance to
54 any municipality, group of municipalities, region or com-
55 munity action agency for the purposes of planning a com-
56 munity action program.
