By Mr. Kearney of Boston, petition of Joseph M. Kearney that school make up days be waived upon cancellation for public interest and safety of school children. Education.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROVIDING THAT SCHOOL MAKE UP DAYS BE WAIVED UPON CANCELLATION FOR PUBLIC INTEREST AND SAFETY OF SCHOOL CHILDREN.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1 of chapter 71 of the General Laws is hereby amended
2 by striking out the first sentence and inserting in place thereof
3 the following sentence:— Every town shall maintain, for at
4 least one hundred and eighty days in each school year unless
5 specifically exempted as to any one year by the department of
6 education, in this chapter called the department, a sufficient
7 number of schools for the instruction of all children who may
8 legally attend a public school therein, provided, however, that
9 any school day cancelled for the public interest and safety of
10 school children shall be included as a regular school day.
