

HOUSE No. 772

By Mr. Finnegan of Boston, petition of the Massachusetts Public School Custodians Association relative to payment of accumulated vacation or sick leave allowance of state employees upon death or separation from service. Public Service.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT RELATIVE TO PAYMENT OF ACCUMULATED VACATION OR SICK LEAVE ALLOWANCE OF STATE EMPLOYEES UPON DEATH OR SEPARATION FROM SERVICE.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 31A of chapter 29 of the General Laws, as most re-
2 cently amended by chapter 680 of the acts of 1954, is hereby
3 further amended by adding the following new subsection (d):—
4 (d) Upon the death or retirement of an officer or employee
5 who is eligible for sick leave under the rules and regulations of
6 said city or town, payment of unused sick leave credits shall be
7 made on the basis of one day for each two days of accumulated
8 sick time. Payments shall be made in the same manner as
9 prescribed in subsections (a), (b) and (c).

The Constitution of the United States

Article I, Section 2, Clause 3

Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be admitted into or excluded from this Union according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons in each State all Persons bound to Service for the Term of Years, and excluding Indians not taxed. But the Enumeration or direct Tax shall be taken in the Year 1790, and in every Tenth Year thereafter, in such Manner as Congress may direct. The Number of Representatives in each State shall not exceed one for every thirty Thousand Persons, but each State shall have at least one Representative, and until 1840, not less than two. No State shall have a greater Number of Representatives than it has Numbers. No Representative shall serve for more than two Terms, but this Limit shall not apply to any Person who has been elected Representative after an Interval of seven Years, or who has acted as Representative after an Interval of seven Years.
