## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH PROPERTY DAMAGE CHECK POINTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF SHOWING ACTUAL DAMAGE TO MOTOR VEHICLES FOLLOWING AN ACCIDENT.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The registrar of motor vehicles is hereby authorized and  
2 directed to establish in such areas of the commonwealth as he  
3 may deem necessary, offices and personnel under his direction  
4 and control to examine the damage to motor vehicles result-  
5 ing from an accident, and to make a written report of the  
6 same. Such reports shall be available to any person having an  
7 interest therein and shall be subject to summons for produc-  
8 tion in a court.
