AN ACT RELATIVE TO THE INCOME ELIGIBILITY OF TENANTS IN HOUSING PROJECTS.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

- 1 Section 32 of chapter 121B of the General Laws is hereby
