By Mr. MacKenzie of Wareham, petition of Charles A. MacKenzie, Jr., that the county commissioners of Plymouth County be directed to acquire land in the town of Wareham for the construction of a new courthouse for the Fourth District Court of Plymouth. Counties.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF PLYMOUTH COUNTY TO ACQUIRE LAND IN THE TOWN OF WAREHAM FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF A NEW COURTHOUSE FOR THE FOURTH DISTRICT COURT OF PLYMOUTH.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The county commissioners of Plymouth county
2 are hereby authorized and directed to acquire by eminent
3 domain, gift or purchase, land in the town of Wareham, for the
4 construction of a new courthouse for the fourth district court of
5 Plymouth. For the purposes of this section the county commis-
6 sioners shall not expend more than twenty-one thousand dollars.

1 SECTION 2. For the purposes of section one the county com-
2 missioners of Plymouth county may issue temporary notes of the
3 county payable in not more than one year from their dates.

In the month of January, 1901, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Washington, D. The Constitutionality of the Resolution

Is the Resolution Constitutional?
