**The Commonwealth of Massachusetts**

In the Year One Thousand Nine Hundred and Seventy.

AN ACT PROHIBITING THE DISPLAY OF HIGH BEAM HEADLAMPS ON MOTOR VEHICLES BEING OPERATED WITHIN FIVE HUNDRED FEET OF ANOTHER MOVING VEHICLE.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 The twelfth sentence of the first paragraph of section 7 of  
2 chapter 90 of the General Laws, as inserted by chapter 309 of  
3 the acts of 1968, is hereby amended by adding at the end thereof  
4 the following clause: — ; and provided further, that an auto-  
5 mobile may not display high beam headlamps when being op-  
6 erated within five hundred feet of another automobile which is  
7 moving in either the same or opposite direction.

In witness whereof, the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, and by the authority of the same, do hereby certify that the following is a true and correct copy of the original of the same, as the same is contained in the records of the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America.

1. The words "United States of America" shall be construed to mean the United States of America as of the date of the adoption of the Constitution.
2. The words "the People" shall be construed to mean the People of the United States as of the date of the adoption of the Constitution.
3. The words "the States" shall be construed to mean the States of the United States as of the date of the adoption of the Constitution.
4. The words "the Territories" shall be construed to mean the Territories of the United States as of the date of the adoption of the Constitution.
5. The words "the Districts" shall be construed to mean the Districts of the United States as of the date of the adoption of the Constitution.
6. The words "the Possessions" shall be construed to mean the Possessions of the United States as of the date of the adoption of the Constitution.
7. The words "the Citizens" shall be construed to mean the Citizens of the United States as of the date of the adoption of the Constitution.
